


And the seasons, they go round and round...

Spaghetti and Meatballs

Our fundraiser dish was such a big hit, we decided that we couldn't keep it to ourselves! Be sure to scale it back, unless you want enough to feed a crowd of 60!

Ingredients

Meatballs

- 4.5 kg ground beef
- 4.5 kg ground pork
- 6-8 eggs, depending on size
- 2 cups breadcrumbs
- 2 cups grated parmesan
- 1 bunch parsley, chopped
- Salt and pepper to taste

Pasta sauce

- 2 chicken breasts, sliced
- 1 kg pork ribs
- 4-6 onions, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 8 L canned tomatoes
- 8 L tomato sauce
- 375 ml can tomato paste
- Seasonings to taste: basil, oregano, salt, pepper, chili peppers

Instructions

Meatballs:

- Combine all ingredients and form into meatballs, 1½ inch diameter.
- Cook meatballs in boiling water, approximately 5-10 minutes, remove and set aside.

Pasta Sauce:

- 1. Sauté chicken breasts, pork ribs, onions and garlic in olive oil.
- Add canned tomatoes, tomato sauce, tomato paste, and seasonings to taste. Allow to simmer for flavours to blend.
- 3. Serve meatballs and sauce over cooked pasta. You'll need approximately 6-7 kgs for this recipe volume. Top with parmesan cheese!

Lake Louise Go International Volunteer Program

This year Friends of Yoho proudly supported the Lake Louise Go International Volunteer Program. The Lake Louise Ski Area hosted 14 volunteers from 6 different countries, who contributed over 2,090 volunteer hours this Summer to improving the Lake Louise/Yoho/Kootenay field unit area. One of their achievements was helping the Kicking Horse Ski Club to hand-prune and limb over 400m of the Tally-Ho crosscountry ski trail.

Accomplishments by the volunteer program for 2019 include:

- Removing over 10 kg of litter from Banff National Park
- Collecting over 1,000 bags of recyclable containers
- Weatherproofing and staining railings, fences and planters
- Piloting a guided hike to Hidden Lake, focusing on species at risk
- Hand-pruning and limbing more than 400 m of the Tally-ho Ski Trail.


